This course will be taught Winter 2026, Tuesdays and Fridays, 3:00-4:50 pm. Some additional time in the form of office hours for students is expected. This is a core course in the UCalgary Bachelor of Design in City Innovation program.

Course Description

Development of skills in visualizing data sets, diagraming and simulating site conditions. Introduction to geographic information systems (GIS) as a platform for visualizing complex urban environments. Complex assemblies simulation -- parametric design intro (DATA).

Requirements

The successful candidate will have completed at least a master's degree in design or a related discipline and have prior teaching experience at the post-secondary level.

4. Required qualifications: professional proficiency in Rhino, ArcGIS (QGIS is not sufficient) and Adobe Suite (Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign).
5. Recommended qualifications: Proficiency in Grasshopper
6. Three letters of reference (required if you have not taught for the faculty before)
7. Description of your qualifications in support of each course you are interested in teaching (could include evidence of teaching effectiveness.)

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. At the time of your application, please answer the following question: Are you a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada? (Yes/No)
