The School of Architecture, Planning and Landscape invites applications for a term certain *Sessional Instructor* to teach ARCH 610 – Structures II. This course will be taught Winter 2024, Mondays and Wednesdays from 9 – 10:30am. Some additional time in the form of office hours for students is expected. This is a core course for students in the Master of Architecture program and is linked to the Comprehensive Design Studio. Coordination with the studio and technology courses is required.

Course Description

Advanced structural systems for buildings including: structural connections and composite structures; system characteristics and architectural intent; and case studies in contemporary building structures.

Requirements

The successful candidate will have completed at least a master's degree in architecture or a related discipline. Candidates with prior teaching at the graduate level are preferred.
